1 MONTH AFTER HAITI EARTHQUAKE

TRANSITIONING TO RECOVERY OPERATIONS

- More than three weeks after the devastating earthquake that hit southwestern Haiti, search and rescue operations in the hardest-hit areas ended on September 2. Efforts are now focused on recovery operations.
 - As of September 3, nearly 46 percent of affected families have received humanitarian assistance.
 - In a context of urgent needs, response efforts continue to face access constraints along the main supply road (Route Nationale #2) which allows aid to be channeled to areas affected by the earthquake in the south.
 - Despite the challenges, strong response efforts are underway in the priority sectors of food, water, sanitation and hygiene, health and emergency shelter.
 - On August 30 and 31, Prime Minister Dr. Ariel Henry officially launched the Post-Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA) process with
- the support of the United Nations system, the European Union, the World Bank and the Inter-American Development Bank.
- UNICEF warns of potential resurgence of waterborne diseases in southwest Haiti, where more than half a million children lack access to shelter, water drinking water and sanitary facilities.
 - As of September 3, the DGPC and IOM have identified at least 26,245 displaced people in 65 displacement sites in the three most affected departments, the majority in the Sud department. Health and shelter remain the most urgent priorities of the humanitarian response.
 - Food assistance needs have sharply increased in Haiti following the earthquake.

ACTIONS TAKEN



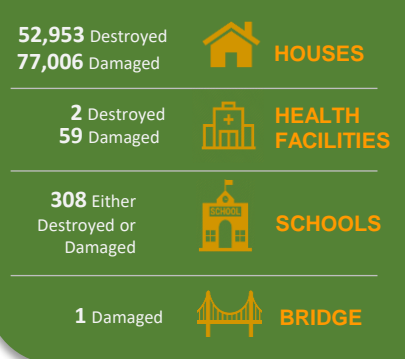
FFTP-Haiti has sent 79 truckloads to the affected departments. The items delivered included food, essential items, medicines and medical supplies.

48 newly built FFTP homes were given to families affected by the earthquake impacting the Grand Anse and Sud departments

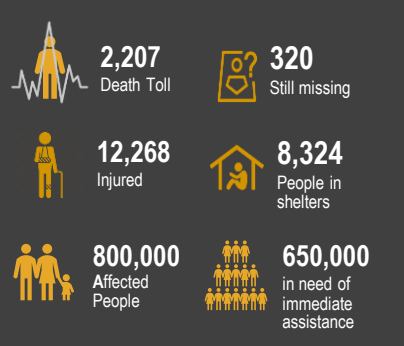
Out of the 79 truckloads, 10 with medicines and medical supplies have been sent to different hospitals and medical facilities of the 3 departments affected.
